

Resolution no. 37/2020

**of the Senate of the Medical University of Gdańsk
dated 29th June 2020**

concerning the terms and conditions of admission of candidates with disabilities or chronically ill to the Medical University of Gdańsk

Pursuant to art. 11 sect. 1 p. 6 letter a and art. 365 p. 6 and art. 23 sect. 1 and sect. 2 p. 2 of the Higher Education and Science Act of Law dated 20th July 2018 (Journal of Laws 2020, it. 85 as amended)

It shall be enacted:

§1

1. This document pertains to candidates with disabilities within the meaning of the law on vocational and social rehabilitation and employment of the disabled dated 27th August 1997 (Journal of Laws 2020, it. 426, as amended) or chronically ill that pursue the admission to the Medical University of Gdańsk
2. Candidates with disabilities or chronically ill (hereinafter referred to as candidates) shall answer equal terms and conditions of admission as candidates who pursue the admission to the Medical University of Gdańsk stated in the proper Resolution of the Senate of the Medical University of Gdańsk, however shall be granted the following:
 - 1) in the case of a disability or chronic illness of the candidate that prevents him/her to participate in the admission process in a manner that is envisioned for such field of study the Faculty Admission Commission shall issue a decision to apply an altered examination form upon the application of the Plenipotentiary of the Disabled
 - 2) the alterations of the examination form can be:
 - a) prolongation of the duration of the examination (50%) in proportion to the duration of the examination for the remaining candidates,
 - b) swimming of the scheduled distance in 1 min 25 seconds in any way possible during the swimming examination.
 - 3) Application mentioned in sect. 2 p. 1 is prepared based on information given by the candidate in:
 - a) registration questionnaire for candidates with disabilities or chronically ill that makes the appendix no. 1 of this resolution,
 - b) interview with the candidate,
 - c) analysis of the documents given by the candidate in compliance with § 2.
3. Shall the altered form of the examination occur, the Plenipotentiary of the Disabled shall inform the candidate in writing.
4. The organisation of the examinations for candidates shall occur in cooperation of the Faculty Admission Commissions, The Admission Office and the Plenipotentiary of the Disabled.

§2

1. While applying for the alterations in the examination the candidate is obliged to:
 - 1) register in the on-line admission system of the Medical University of Gdańsk to meet the admission requirements;
 - 2) apply to the Plenipotentiary of the Disabled to fill in the registration questionnaire;

- 3) report the need to alter the form of the examination no later than 10 workdays before the scheduled date of the examination (in compliance with the template that makes the appendix no. 2 of this resolution);
 - 4) place the medical documentation to the Plenipotentiary of the Disabled that states the kind of disability, including the certificate of disability and the degree or the chronic illness.
2. Shall the candidate be unable to register themselves in the online admission system of the Medical University of Gdańsk, they shall go to the Admission Office of the Medical University of Gdańsk. There, the employee shall register the candidate.
 3. Shall the Plenipotentiary of the Disabled find the documentation insufficient, the candidate shall provide additional documents.
 4. Documents placed at the Plenipotentiary of the Disabled's office that declare the health condition of the candidate shall not be issued earlier than 90 days before placing, certificate of the disability with the degree excluded. In the case of Polish citizens these documents shall be issued by entities who possess the agreement with the National Health Funds. Candidates who do not have Polish citizenship are obliged to place the proper documents in English or translated to Polish by a sworn translator.
 5. Medical documentation placed at the Plenipotentiary of the Disabled is confidential. Sensitive personal data management is possible only when the candidate grants permission in writing.
 6. The insight into the given documentation is granted to the Rector, University Admission Commission and Faculty Admission Commission.

§3

1. This resolution comes into effect on the date of its adoption.
2. Resolution no. 32/2018 of the Senate of the Medical University of Gdańsk loses its binding form.
3. Regulations mentioned in this resolution apply to the admission process from the academic year 2020/2021.
